Goes To Memphis



BISHOP R. PILARSKI, Aviation Machinist's Mate, first class, U. S. N., has reported to Memphis Training Center, after spending several days leave here with his wife, the former Miss Margaret Hyatt, and his young daughter, at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Ernest J. Hyatt.

He has recently been attached to Patrol Bombing Squadron III which operated bases on Pacific Islands. His was the vitally important job of seeing that his squadrons big four-motored Liberators were kept in fighting order at all times.

Though the primary mission of his squadron was to search out and report back movements of the enemy's fleet, air or land forces, the Liberator crews often inflicted heavy damage on enemy shipping and installation.

He has seen action on the Bonin Islands, the Philippines, and the recent Okinawa invasion and prior to his Pacific war cruise he was in combat service in North Africa.

He is entitled to wear the Pre-Pearl Harbor ribbon, Good Conduct, Yantze medal, North-African-European ribbon, Asiatic-Pacific theater, American Theater, Philippine Liberator and four combat stars.

He is the son of Mrs. W. PilarSKI, of Chicago and has a total of nine years to his credit in the service. Having previously served he re-enlisted in the Navy in April, 1942.
