Other services which may come to farmers in the district include extensive drainage surveys, laying out fire breaks in the forests, the drainage plans, the allotment of operating farmers also kindred seedlings. Equipment which the farm owners need to carry on their operations is furnished the district without charge. Other equipment

Rathbone and children and Mrs. Paul Ledford and small daughter, Marianna of Arkansas designed to do erosion control work may be granted to the district for the supervisors to use in their

program and work plan. These services are to landowners in soil conservation districts at no expense to the farmers of the district. No levy in the farm taxes can be made by the supervisors unless it is duly authorized by the land owners themselves.

There is very little cost attached to the organization of a soil conservation district. The expense incurred in this procedure must be borne by the county or some organization operating in the county. The cost of running all legal notices in the county paper, cost of charter and other incidental

expenses will not exceed fifty or sixty dollars.

It is not possible to give anything like all the information which the public would like to have on a proposition like this. North Carolina, eighty-three are organized soil conservation districts, there being twenty-one districts in the state which approximates four counties to the district. Between 21,000 and 22,000 landowners in this state are now following a conservation farm plan developed in soil conservation districts, and are using the erosion control practices developed for these farms.

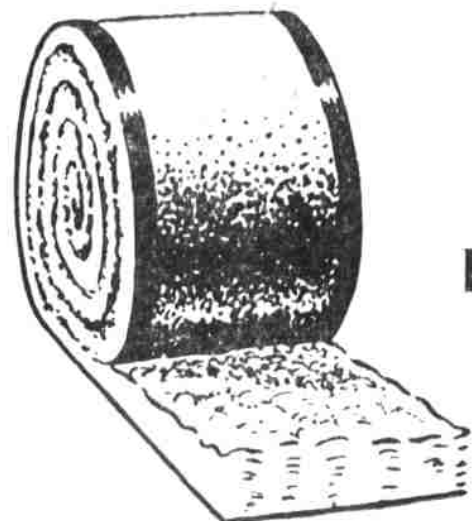

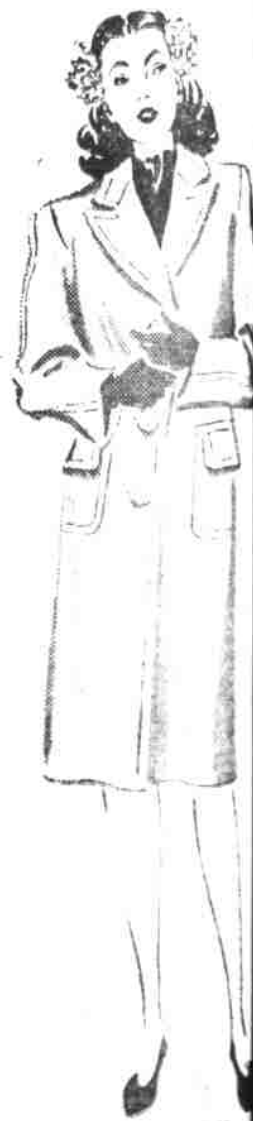
