

Fifty-one Peaks In Park Are Over A Mile High

Many Thrills In Store For Anyone Climbing Them

The Great Smoky Mountains National Park contains 51 peaks and gaps more than a mile high, according to a list compiled from records of the U. S. Geological Survey.

According to the list, there are 20 mountain peaks in the park area with an altitude of 6,000 feet or more. Twenty-three peaks have an altitude of over 5,280 feet but less than 6,000 feet, while eight mountain gaps are over 5,280.

The highest peak in the park is Clingman's Dome, which rises 6,642 feet above sea level. Next in size is Mt. Guyot, which is 6,621 feet high.

All of the peaks are located within the park area, which consists of approximately 428,000 acres. The Newfound gap, over which runs the main highway to the Great Smoky Mountains National Park, is only a few hundred feet less than a mile high, its altitude being 5,045 feet.

Memorial Plaque

The founders of Great Smoky Mountains National Park are honored with a memorial at Newfound Gap, on the North Carolina-Tennessee line. A bronze plaque on a high terrace wall of the memorial bears the following inscription:

"FOR THE PERMANENT ENJOYMENT OF THE PEOPLE This Park Was Given One-Half By The Peoples And States of North Carolina and Tennessee And By The United States of America And One-Half In Memory of Laura Spelman Rockefeller By The Laura Spelman Rockefeller Memorial Founded by Her Husband John D. Rockefeller."

MEATS, FATS—Red Stamps K2 through P2	July 31
Red Stamps Q2 through U2	August 31
Red Stamps V2 through Z2	September 30
Red Stamps A1 through E1	October 31
PROCESSED FOODS—Blue Stamps T2 through X2	July 31
Blue Stamps Y2, Z2, A1, B1, C1	August 31
Blue Stamps D1 through H1	September 30
Blue Stamps J1 through N1	October 31
SUGAR STAMPS—36	August 31
FUEL OIL—Period 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 coupons, good for ten gallons per unit, continue valid throughout the country for the rest of the heating year. New Period 1 coupon in the 1945-46 ration may be used anytime after June 1.	
SHOES—Airplanes Stamps No. 1, 2, 3, in Book Three continue valid indefinitely.	
GASOLINE—A-16 coupons valid through September 21	

Airplane Stamp No. 4 in War Ration Book No. 3 would become valid as a shoe stamp on August 1. Airplane Stamps Nos. 1, 2, and 3 are valid indefinitely.
