"You will find your returning service man not a great deal different," was the prediction of Capt. Bill Erwin, chaplain in the air corps, who has recently returned from overseas, and is resting at Lake Junaluska. He addressed the Rotary Club last week.

"Foxholes do not make Christians," he said. "There are too many not sincere in their religious matters. I have had men tell me they prayed for hours while on a dangerous mission, and in a short time after landing would be dead drunk, out with notorious women, and cursing up a storm," he continued. "That is not true religion."
