week of August 6-12, 1944. Four Panzer divisions struck at the 30th Division defenses in the morning of August 7, in a try split the First and Third American arndes. The 823rd, along with the other elements of the 30th Division, held the Nazis at bay, and through their gallant efforts thwarted the Nazi plans to drive through to the sea.

For six days the superior force continued extremely heavy pressure, in many instances completely isolating groups of the American forces. Though subject to fierce attacks by day and night, and though many casualties were suffered, this brave group of men effectively blocked the enemy's advance, inflicting crushing casualties upon his personnel and destroying much of the equipment. according to the citation.
