and he talked to his followers about the things that Jesus revealed about himself. Jesus Christ knew his own mind and was stored in his memory. He not only knew it but he lived it.

"We read that on a Sunday morning walk with two friends, Jesus quoted from memory a great deal of the Old Testament into his Bible. It is wonderful to see how our Lord, though he grew up in a village and had no formal education, knew his Bible so well in the Hebrew but in Greek and Aramaic. What a shame that we don't know it even at our mother tongue.

"The Bible was the one book Jesus possessed, and yet he did not own a copy but he borrowed the scrolls, on which the sacred writings were inscribed, from the village priest. No other book had any place in his reading.

"And he believed his Bible. It is written were the words chosen to settle any misunderstanding or controversy. And our Lord used his Bible. It was not just a sacred book to be put on the altar.

In our time the Bible is the most widely written but not the most widely read book. Our Lord used his Bible to live by. The Old Testament was the pre-written life of our Lord and he lived it to it. He found hidden beauties in his Bible which those who write about it do not know was there. Jesus had a much poorer Bible than we have for he had only the Old Testament and we have also the New Testament. How much more might our richer Bible mean to us.

"There is no greater need in our current day than to return to the Bible to the thinking and the words of our leaders. It is a fountain that cannot be exhausted. We need to come back to the Bible as a part of the education of the people into whose hands it is placed. Once more will our Christ burn within us when we join Christ's school and let the Bible mean to us what it meant to him."

Nation-Wide Era Of Building Is Predicted By Housing Authorities

This country is about to embark on one of the greatest building eras in its history, and according to housing authorities this community will have a part in the nation-wide program of construction.

The confident prediction by national authorities is that the rosy picture of millions of new home-minimum Americans will result in thousands of homes.

The field for home building is wide open. The United States has lagged behind in building ever since the depression and it will take at least ten years to catch up, housing experts say.

Construction has been critical for some time, and from plans underway it would appear that as soon as materials are available, the program will get started.

Great developments are expected during the ten years ahead. Low-cost housing is still in its infancy, and demand for substantially constructed homes to sell for around \$2,000 to \$4,000 is tremendous throughout the United States.

Some believe that new developments in prefabrication of individual homes may be the answer. Others see it in mass building of multi-houses in one locality.

Housing experts are hopeful that one way may be found by which construction may be carried on through the 12 months of the year regardless of weather, thus giving a year-around but lower cost and enabling builders to reduce costs proportionately.

Such valuable experience has been gained, meanwhile during the war. Some 1,800,000 houses have been built for war needs, about 1,500,000 of which are of a permanent character.

This experience has introduced many builders to an entirely new market and has also brought the materials and labor together. It has applied the same energy and cooperation to peacetime problems, the solution to these problems will be quickly found.

President Truman has high hopes for big developments in the housing field. He predicted some specific aid that it will provide a great new industry for the nation, and one which he believes will be more important than the automobile industry ever was.
