At the last meeting Col. J. H. Howell addressed the club on America's part in finishing up the war. He stressed the fact that both Germany and Japan must be completely disarmed and made impotent to build implements of war in the future. Col. Howell was presented by Lee Davis, chairman of the committee on sight conservation.

The club was honored by a visit from District Governor, Ed McMahan, and Deputy Governor, Bill White. Lion McMahan stated that the district is in the best shape it has ever been. New members have been added to all the clubs in the district, and eight new clubs organized with charters.

Speaking of the strength of Lionism, the Governor said, "Our strength is found in the work we are doing in conserving eye sight of underprivileged children, and work with the blind." Thirty-Two Lakes Opened In State For Fishing

Thirty-two lakes in North Carolina will be opened with no closed fishing season until further notice is given, according to action taken by the North Carolina Board of Conservation and Development. It was learned this week from G. C. Holt, Haywood game and fish warden.

Nine of the lakes which are opened by Haywood residents include: Hwassee Lake, Cherokee county; Nantahala, Macon county; Tatuga Lake, Clay; Lake Santee, Graham; Lake Cheoah, Graham; Glensville Lake, Jackson county; Waterville, Haywood; Lake Lure, Rutherford; and Lake James, Burke county.

DEATH PENALTY FOR DIVULGENCE ATOM DATA

Legislation providing the death penalty for divulging atomic bomb secrets to foreign powers has been introduced. With \$2,000,000,000 of public funds invested in it and the world's domination of war, this important secret must be carefully guarded, Congressmen said.

AUTO-FINANCED RATE TO DROP

The consensus of opinion of men who handle automobile loans, the method by which 50 per cent of new cars and 70 per cent of used cars were bought before the war, is that the new cars can be financed at a lower rate than your new car.

Belgian railroads have ordered 2,000 cars from Great Britain, 6,000 from the United States, and 10,000 from domestic industry, while 220 locomotives were ordered from Canada, 30 from the U. S., and 213 from local producers.

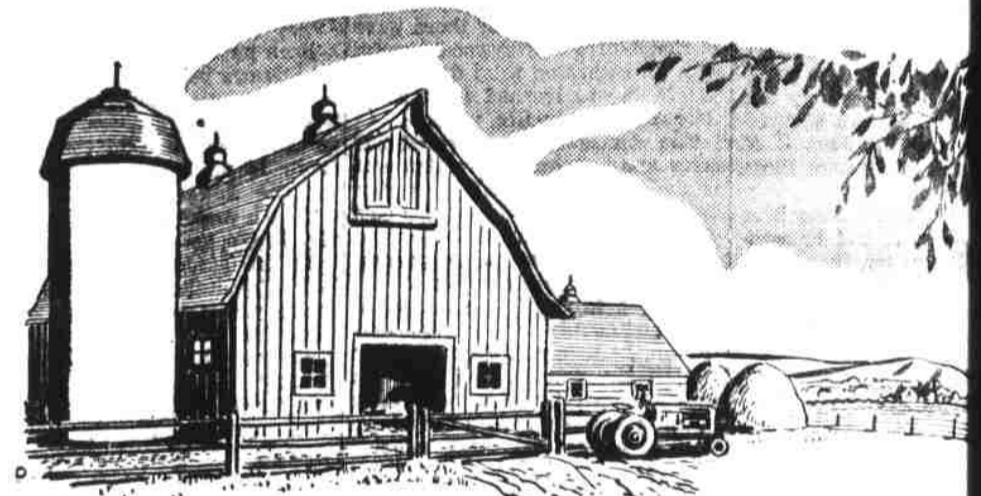
