Pfc. Raymond Rathbone Arrives From Overseas

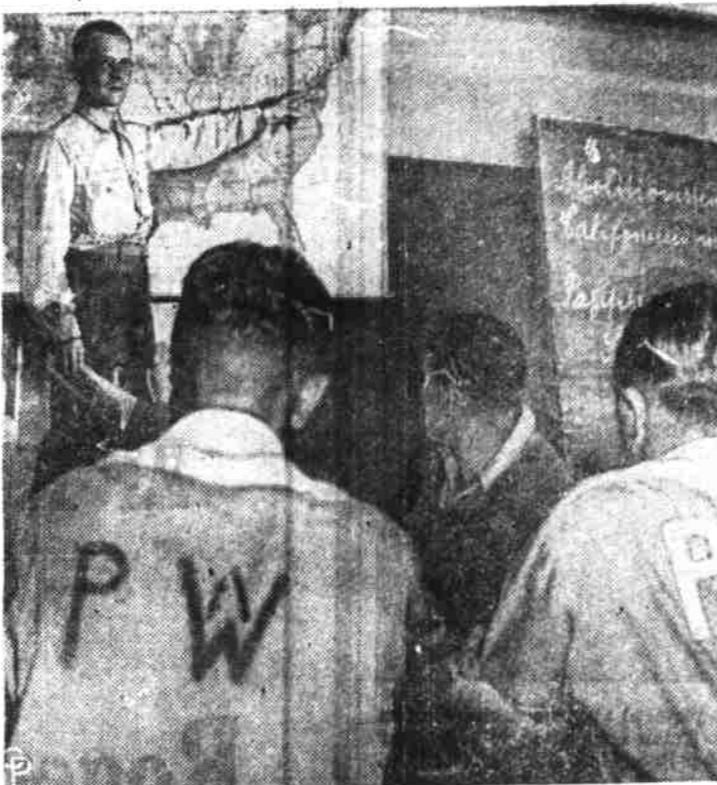
