Clarence S. Shelton, seaman, first class, USNR, of Waynesville, R.F.D. No. 2, is serving in the Pacific on the USS Montpelier. He was on this ship when she helped remove more than 2,000 liberated prisoners of war from Wakayama, Honshu, Japan. This light cruiser was the flagship for Rear Admiral Ralph S. Riggs, commander of the evacuation unit.

The cruiser, commissioned in Sept. 1942, saw action at Guadalcanal, Kolombangara, the Solomon Islands, Bougainville, the Shortlands, the Battle of Empress Augusta Bay, the Bismarcks, Espen, the Battle of the Philippines Sea, the Marianas, Leyte, Mindoro, Lingayen, Gulu, Mindoro, and Brunei Bay and Balikpapan in Borneo.

Lid On Auto Repairs

Definite limits on the amount of time which may be charged for the 56 most common automotive repair jobs now bring these operations under actual dollars and cents ceiling prices.

According to Mr. Driscoll the regulation also requires that repair shops give the customer an invoice.

Ceiling On

Sauerkraut, both canned and bulk, appearing on the grocery shelves this year are now exempt from price control.

Ceiling prices on white potatoes will also continue to be suspended for the period beginning October 25 and ending December 5.

Used Car Transfers

Sellers of used cars, rather than the purchasers, are now required to file certificates of transfer with the War Price Rationing Boards.

Today's action relieves the purchaser of the necessity of making a trip to his ration board.

Building Program Spells Farmer's Safety

Farmers will benefit directly from OPA's all-inclusive program to set rigid dollars and cents ceilings on the prices of building materials and construction services.

Under OPA's new plan, now being worked out in detail, for maintaining reasonable prices on building materials, and for setting ceiling prices on the charges made for construction services, hundreds of farmers can now make the repairs they postponed during the war.
