to Fort Benning, Ga., to Officers Candidate School. Upon graduation Lt. Sloan was sent to Camp Howze, Tex., where he remained until he was sent overseas in April, 1942. Joining the 88th Division in Italy as a reinforcement officer he remained as an infantry combat officer until August when he was transferred to the Engineer Corps where he held a responsible position supplying water to the 14th Army until the end of the war. He returned to the States in October, 1945.

He is entitled to wear the American defense ribbon, American theater, European-African-Middle East service ribbon with three battle stars and the Purple Heart for wounds received in Italy. Robert L. Sloan, Chief Warrant Officer, volunteered in the service in December, 1940 and was assigned to Service Company, 129th Infantry Regiment, 30th Infantry Division, where he remained until he accepted appointment as Warrant Officer in May, 1942. He was then transferred to Headquarters, 30th Infantry Division in June, 1942 and remained there throughout training periods at Camp Blanding, Camp Forrest, Camp Atterbury and Camp Miles Standish and England.

He went overseas with the Division in February, 1944, remained in England until June and shortly after D-Day the Division was thrown into action in Normandy. He was with the 30th Division until July, 1945 when on account of the redeployment plan, he was transferred to the 76th Infantry Division and the 9th Armored Division for return home and demobilization. He arrived in the States on October 7, and is at present on terminal leave, pending discharge.




