Withholding Tax  
Schedule For '46

Washington, Nov. 3.—The table below shows the amounts of Federal income tax that will be withheld from pay envelopes in 1946 under the \$5,920,000,000 tax reduction bill, and compares them with tax money withheld this year.

The table is based on one-week pay roll periods.  
Note: A single man ordinarily would claim one withholding exemption, a married man with wife and one child three exemptions, etc. The "None" exemption column is designed for use where both spouses work and where one wishes to give the other advantage of both exemptions.

Table with columns: Wages But At Least, Number of Withhold Exemptions Claimed (None, One, Two, Three), and corresponding tax amounts for 1945 and 1946.

(1)—Denotes 17 per cent of wages.  
(2)—Denotes 18 per cent of wages.
