He entered the service in 1943 and was inducted at Camp Croft, and from there was sent to Indo, Calif., for desert training at the center there.

He was attached to the 106th Division, and is entitled to wear the European Theater ribbon, with two battle stars, the Good Conduct medal and the Infantryman's combat badge. At the time he entered the service he was employed by the Underwood Supply company.

During the past 12 months of the war, the TVA turned out 12,227,696,195 kilowatt hours of electrical power, he has announced. The authority's top priority customer during the past two years, according to Wessenaue, was the atomic bomb plant at Oak Ridge, Tenn.

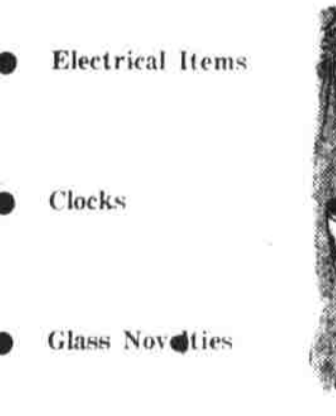
