How much cream to whip at a time depends on the size of the whipper. The usual small household beater does the best lob with no more than a pint of cream. If larger quantities are to be whipped, time will be saved by whipping in successive batches.

Tobacco sales will adjourn the 21st, and to permit buyers to clear up their heavy purchases, sales will not be resumed until January 7th.

Some complaint has been made as to reduced classification - Most of this, however, has been due to red and mixed grades, in some instances two or more grades tied in the same bundle. Due to the heavy offerings, handling facilities have been taxed to the utmost and labor being hard to obtain, buyers have no time to lose over mixed grades.
