Community Tree At Canton 'Y' Set For Monday

The annual community Christmas tree program will be held at the Champion YMCA Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock, when three hundred or more children of this area will share in the distribution of gifts.

A brief program, including the singing of the familiar Christmas carols, will be given with managers of the town participating. Dr. E. P. Billups, pastor of Central Methodist church, will give the invocation and direct the carol singing. The Rev. D. O. Melmus of the Presbyterian church, will read the Christmas story, and Rev. J. Y. Kelly, of the First Baptist church, will give the benediction. Mrs. Sam M. Robinson will be the piano accompanist.

Since there is not a large quantity of one item to be secured, the gifts this year will be of several varieties, according to Mrs. J. K. Thompson, chairman of the purchasing committee. Toys for each boy and girl have been secured such as story and picture books, marbles, puzzles, etc. The package will also include fruits and candy. The committee will be prepared to take care of all the needy children who may attend, it was stated Wednesday.

Gifts for the 17 colored children whose names have been received will be delivered to an appointed representative, and will be presented at their Christmas tree program at the Baptist church on Christmas Eve.

Gifts for the 25 or more inmates at the county home will consist of some useful articles and fruits and candy.

The dime board collection have been very gratifying, despite the extreme cold weather, amounting to approximately \$400. The next collections will be continued through Monday, Chairman Cabe stated.

Farm Questions and Answers

QUESTION: When does a sweet potato become a yam?

ANSWER: Hazel Meacham, in charge of Extension Work at State College, has just returned from a trip to Eastern potato markets and a study of sweet potato crosses the Western Dixon Line, it becomes a yam.

"Consumers in the East and South are making an impression on the yam as an improved sweet potato," Meacham explains. "It has been made with the familiar sweet potato, but the sweet potato was changed to red 2000 pounds for 20 cents and the yam for 20 cents and the sweet potato much more quickly."

QUESTION: How can I protect my chickens from getting cold?

ANSWER: Here's where a pound of prevention is worth more than a pound of cure. Cold, influenza, croup, and bronchitis are the most common ailments of poultry. To avoid such infections by providing such things as ventilation without drafts, and plenty of floor space per bird. Once established, such infections are not hard to control and usually quite costly in reduced production and high mortality.

QUESTION: Some of our chickens are paralyzed. What can I do about it?

ANSWER: This was reported in relation to Extension Station, Specialist T. T. Brown by the Waynesville Prison in Raleigh. On inspection of the poultry, Brown found

the chickens were drinking from mud holes and were given milled feed. He recommended that the feed be placed on a board and not allowed to come in contact with the concrete floor, where it would take up dampness and become damaged. He also suggested that the hens be given plenty of clean water at all times and that the feed be taken out of the water during winter, if possible.
