Fix Retail Ceilings On Lumber Products

WASHINGTON—The OPA has authorized its regional offices to fix dollar-and-cent price ceilings for retail sales of softwood lumber, shingles and hardwood flooring. The agency described this as a move to obtain more effective control over prices for building materials. Previously ceiling for these products had been determined under a formula which made it difficult, OPA said, for purchasers to calculate prices for themselves.
