Sgt. Verlin Setzer Discharged From Army At Fort Bragg

Sergeant Verlin Setzer, son of Mr. and Mrs. William Setzer, of the Wayne section of the county, has received his discharge from the army. He entered the service in May, 1942 while he was a student at the Waynesville Township high school.

Sgt. Setzer was inducted at Fort Bragg and from there was sent to Fort Knox, Ky., and later on maneuvers in Louisiana. From the latter he was transferred to Camp Swift, Texas, and then to New York and overseas. He served for 22 months in the European theater. He was first stationed in England and was with the American forces in the invasion. He served in France, Belgium, Holland, and Germany, and was with the army of occupation for three months.

Sgt. Setzer was attached to the 29th Division of the 9th Army. He is entitled to wear the Good Conduct medal, the European Theater ribbon with four battle stars, the Bronze Arrowhead, and the Victory medal.

Mr. and Mrs. Earl Messer have as their guests the latter's brother and his wife, Mr. and Mrs. F. B. Ewing, both of whom have recently been discharged from the service. Mr. Ewing has been serving with the U. S. navy with the rating of SP-1A first class, and his last post of duty was at the Naval base in Jacksonville, Fla. Mrs. Ewing served for three years as radio-man, second class in the WAVES and was also discharged from the service in Jacksonville. She was before her marriage, Miss Belle Duncan, of Charleston, S. C.
