Lewis A. Kirkpatrick Discharged From Navy

Lewis A. Kirkpatrick, seaman first class, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. L. Kirkpatrick, of Fines Creek, has been discharged from the U. S. navy. He entered the service on October 26, 1943 and was inducted at Camp Croft.

From Croft he was sent to Bain- bridge, Md., where he took his boot training and was later sent to a gunnery school at Norfolk. From the latter he was sent to Camp Shelton, Va., where he was as- signed to sea duty. He served on board the SS Gulfway and the SS Brandy Station, merchant marine ships. His duties on these ships took him practically all over the world.

He is entitled to wear the Amer- ican Theater ribbon, European Theater and Pacific Theater rib- bons, the Philippine Liberation medal and the Victory medal.

At the time he entered the navy as a volunteer he was a student in high school, and plans to return to school.

Seaman Kirkpatrick had four brothers in the service; two who have received their discharges, Private First Class Paul, who was on duty in Europe, and Ed, chief torpedoman, U. S. navy. Two brothers are still in the service. Lee Kirkpatrick, chief boatswain, now in Washington and Private First Class Russell, at Camp Schanks, N. Y.
