A Hint to Beginner Cooks— Bake the Pie Crust First

 IN my early days of cooking and baking until nearly the present, I never baked a pie crust first except in cases where the filling was completely cooked and poured in the baked crust then the meringue put on and browned in a slow oven. I couldn't see how a crust that had been baked could be kept from burning when a filling was put in and the whole thing baked again.

Possibly some of you new cooks will have the same feeling, so in the two pie recipes I'm giving you today, go boldly ahead and you will come out all right. Putting the unbaked crust into a very hot oven for 10 mins. or so and then lowering the heat when you are baking a custard mix pie, used to do the trick, but the baking of the crust first is better.

Pumpkin or Squash Pie
 1 1/2 c. cooked pumpkin or squash
 1 c. milk
 1/2 c. sugar
 1 tsp. cinnamon
 Heat pumpkin or squash, milk, sugar, spices and salt in a double boiler, add beaten eggs and butter and mix well. Pour the hot filling into a deep baked pastry shell and bake in a moderate oven (350 deg. F.) about 30 mins., or until filling sets.

Sweet Potato Pie
 1 1/2 c. boiled, sliced sweet potatoes
 2 eggs
 1/4 c. milk
 1/4 c. sugar
 1/2 tsp. ginger
 1/2 tsp. salt
 2 eggs
 2 tsp. butter
 Heat sweet potatoes, milk, sugar, ginger and salt in a double boiler, add beaten eggs and butter and mix well. Pour hot filling into a deep baked pastry shell and bake in a moderate oven (350 deg. F.) for about 30 mins. or until filling sets.

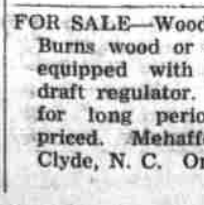
