The document was signed by King John of England in 1215 as a voluntary relinquishment of most of his powers

Brought to the United States in 1939 for the New York World's Fair and kept here when the war started, the Lincoln Cathedral copy of the manuscript was handed back to British Minister John Balfour recently by Dr. Luther H

Evans, Librarian of Congress. Accepting the document, Mr Balfour commented that the great charter was the forefather of both the American and British bill of rights, the British habeas corpus act and the American Declaration
