

# Priorities On Building Materials Granted Veterans

15 priorities assist moderate-cost housing to veterans of World War II. Preference went into location forms are now through the 52 field of Federal Housing Administration.

applications which meet the standards.

Q. What are some of the standards?

A. The applicant must:

1. Be willing to abide by the \$10,000 ceiling set on sales or the \$80 ceiling set on rentals.
2. Give veterans preference in buying or renting during the period of construction and for 30 days after completion.
3. Have obtained control of the land involved, made the necessary arrangements for financing construction and for obtaining utilities services, etc., and secured any necessary local building permits;
4. Be ready to start construction within 60 days of the time the rating is issued;
5. Show a reasonable relationship between the quality and location of the dwellings and the sales or rental price named in the application.

Q. How long must I wait for action on my application?

A. The standards have purposefully been made simple so that quick action can be taken on the applications.

Q. After I get the HH rating and serial number, what do I do?

A. Place your order for critical building materials with any dealer, and accompany it with the special statement found in (d) (1) of PR-33.

Q. Suppose something happens to prevent my starting construction within the 60-day period?

A. In that event your HH rating becomes invalid, unless your request to FHA for an extension is approved.

Q. What happens to housing construction begun before January 15, when this plan goes into effect, but which comes within the price ceiling and on which veterans will be given preference?

A. Builders in this class may apply for HH ratings for any necessary critical materials.

Q. What about the housing begun before January 15, but on which the sales or rental prices will exceed the ceiling?

A. Builders of such housing will be able to draw upon the approximately 50% of the building materials which will not be set aside for the conversion housing program.

Q. Can any veteran who wants to build his house himself, or to buy his materials and hire his own carpenters, etc., come within the program?

A. Yes. His application for an HH rating will receive exactly the same treatment as that of the professional builder.

Q. How will the Civilian Production Administration keep track of the amounts of available critical building materials against

### which HH ratings can be applied?

A. By a cumulative record of approved applications, balanced against materials production reports.

Q. Who will get the preference ratings, since it is estimated that between two and three million veterans and their families will need housing in 1946, but only some 400,000 to 500,000 dwelling units will result, in 1946, from the reconversion housing program?

A. Because of the standards set for the approval of applications, the availability of labor, the effects of adverse weather on buildings, and unavoidable delays in arranging for land and financing and other preparations for building, it is hoped that the actual number of applications received will not exceed the availability of materials. But, if applications prove to be excessive, it may be necessary to establish a quota basis for the granting of ratings by areas and by time periods, in relationship to the availability of materials.

## Veteran May Work On Farm Taking Training

An extensive training program has recently been inaugurated through the cooperation of the State Board of Vocational Education and Veterans Administration, which will give agricultural training, according to Tal H. Safford, district supervisor for agricultural education and J. C. Brown, state senior training officer for the Veterans Administration.

Under the ruling a veteran may train on an employer farm or his own farm, or a farm in which he has some financial interest. This is a cooperative plan whereby the veteran is taking training while on a job, with additional institutional training, through the aid of the agricultural vocational teacher in that area.

This does not mean that the veteran will have to attend classes, but that he will be given individual aid by the teacher. He will also be given some financial help while getting practical farm training while working on a farm in the same manner he would if attending college.

Any veteran wishing to take advantage of this training offered in agriculture may get in touch with the vocational teacher in their local high school or other educational agencies in the district, and they may obtain full information, it was learned from Mr. Brown.

## Tax Official To Be Here In March

A representative of the Internal Revenue Service will be on the second floor of the Post Office for the purpose of assisting taxpayers of the Waynesville area in filing their Federal Income Tax Returns, on the following dates:

Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, March 6, 7, and 8, and Monday through Friday, March 11, through 15.

Persons whose total income was from wages or salaries must have their Form W-2, withholding receipt with them for all work done during 1945. Others must have all income from all sources and an itemized statement of all expenses, to whom paid and for what in order to prevent delay in making out the return.

Individuals whose income was more than \$500.00 for the year are required to file returns, those who had less than \$500.00 but from whose wages tax was withheld must file if they receive a refund of the tax that has been withheld.

The taxpayer cannot claim as expenses, bus fare to and from work, work clothing or laundry of same, meals or room, neither can the auto use stamp, jewelry tax, admission tax, transportation, phone, or cigarette taxes be deducted, the representative said.
