Rufus Scruggs, QM 3/c Discharged From Navy At Camp Shelton

Rufus Scruggs, QM, third class, U. S. Navy, was recently discharged from the service at Camp Shelton, Va. He entered the service as a volunteer in 1942, while a student at the Waynesville high school.

He was sent to Great Lakes for his boot training and then to the Gunnery School at the Naval Base in Norfolk, where he was later assigned to sea duty aboard the USS Sims, for service in the Atlantic.

After serving in the Atlantic Theatre he was sent to the Naval Training center at Long Beach, Calif., and upon completion of the courses there was assigned to the USS Dutton, and was sent to the Pacific, where he served for two years.

Young Scruggs is entitled to wear the American theater ribbon, the European theater ribbon, Philippine liberation ribbon, China Expeditionary medal, Purple Heart (having been wounded on Okinawa on May 27, 1945), Victory Medal, and the Pacific theater ribbon with four battle stars.
