Funds Voted To Go After Black M. Tax Evaders

WASHINGTON—The House has passed a \$1,604,556,940 Treasury-Post Office appropriation bill for the 1947 fiscal year containing funds for a crackdown on "Black Market" tax evaders.

Approval by voice vote sent the measure to the Senate in the same form it was approved by the House Appropriations Committee.

The vote came after the chamber voted down, 56 to 26, a silver bloc attempt to knock out an authorization for Treasury sale of silver for industrial uses at 71.11 cents an ounce.

The bill left unchanged the Treasury's authority to pay out an estimated \$5,000,000,000 in interest on the national debt in the fiscal year beginning next July 1 and \$1,570,000,000 for tax refunds.

The direct appropriations include \$325,495,500 for the Treasury's operations and \$1,279,061,440 for the Post Office Department.

The Bureau of Internal Revenue was voted \$184,707,000, an increase of nearly \$49,000,000 over the current appropriation, largely because of its drive on war-time tax evaders.

More than 40,000 cases of tax evasion, many of them involving black market operators, now are under investigation or awaiting investigation, the House Appropriations Committee was informed by Treasury officials.

Pfc. McKay was sent overseas in October, 1944, and served in combat in the Rhineland, Central Europe, and Germany. He was attached to the 244th Engineers Combat Battalion and was in the European theater for 16 months.

Pfc. McKay is entitled to wear the American Theater service medal; EAME service medal with three bronze stars; Good Conduct medal; and World War 2 Victory medal.

At the time he entered the service Pfc. McKay was employed at the A. C. Lawrence Leather Company.
