Traffic Returns To Pre-War Mark

Both Volume and Speed Levels of 1939 Reached Again, State Survey Shows

James H. Burch, head of the statistics and planning division of the State Highway Commission, said indicated North Carolina had returned to its pre-war traffic volume and speed levels.

The survey, conducted through road checking stations established at various points in the state, were held in February and early March.

earlier this month showed the average speed of all motor vehicles at about 44 miles per hour-which was the pre-war level.

Other facts revealed by the that 18 per cent of all motor vehicles checked exceeded the 50mile-an-hour speed limit, and that the average speed in March was Putnum, Bobbie S. Smith. seven miles faster than in the same month in 1942 and 1943, when rationing was at its height.

The surevy also showed that 50 per cent of all operators drove within the 39 to 48-mile-an-hour bracket, and that 85 per cent of all motorists drove under 51 miles an hour. Highest speeds were attained by out-of-state cars, with passenger buses second.


