**Anderson Now Director Of State Investigators**

RALEIGH—Walter Anderson, formerly police chief at Charlotte and Winston-Salem, was sworn in last week as director of the State Bureau of Investigation.

Anderson, who will be paid \$5,500 a year, succeeds Tom Creekmore, who has been offered a post on the legal staff of the far eastern court trying Japanese war criminals. Creekmore also has been offered a job with the State probation office.

The new director was sworn in by Associate Justice A. A. F. Seawell of the State Supreme Court.

**Woodrow Arrington Honorably Discharged**

Woodrow Arrington has been honorably discharged from the army, after serving for four years and eight months. He was inducted at Fort McPherson in July, 1941, in the first group to leave this area under the selective service system. There were 13 in the call entering the army at that time from the Waynesville area.

He is entitled to wear the Good Conduct medal, the Asiatic-Pacific theater ribbon, the American Defense medal, the American Theater ribbon. He served with the 161st Infantry Division in the South Pacific and in Japan.

**1,497 Men From Canton Area Have Been Discharged**

From a total of 2,359 men who served in the armed forces during World War II from the Canton draft board area, 1,497 have been discharged, it was revealed by J. D. Mackey, chief clerk.

The Canton board governs Beaverdam, Clyde, Cecil, Pigeon and East Fork townships in Haywood county.

Still serving their country are 370 inductees, together with 136 registrants who enlisted and have not yet been discharged. Also in service are 356 men who volunteered but who are not registered with the Canton board. Mr. Mackey explained.
