This secretary will be available as a contact man. He will be familiar with the laws that affect veterans and their rights and will know the benefits to which they are entitled under the laws of their country. The secretary in each case will go into detail and will let me have all the facts so that I may be able to render more efficient service on behalf of the veterans and their Nursing Officials
