## What Colleges Face In 1950 Attendance

d now, just wait until 1950.

W. D. Carmichael, controller of the University of North Carolina, said recently that during that year North Carolina colleges could expect 50,000 persons, above present enrollment, to seek admission.

Reporting on a meeting of the National Education Association and the Veterans Administration in Chicago, Carmichael said 1950 was expected to be the peak year in the number of veterans wanting college training.

He spoke at a meeting of the executive committee of University of North Carolina trustees, following which it was announced that Governor Cherry would appoint a committee to study the problem. The committee will report to the Governor, who may then call a con-

ference of North Carolina college The trustees' executive committee approved the addition of \$100, 000 to the \$1,000,000 which will be borrowed for the crection of two

dormitories at State College. The additional money was found necessary when bids on the projects were higher than anticipated, The \$1,100,000 will be borrowed by the N. C. State Foundation, Inc., from the Wachovia Bank and Trust Company, The sum will be paid with returns from rent.
