**Seeking Engineers Lead Better World**

PITTSBURGH — Some of the world's leading natural scientists and engineers, men whose names and achievements dominated the headlines of World War II, will meet for the first time since the fighting began, and plan for making the world a better place in which to live.

They will meet here May 16-18 at the George Westinghouse Centennial Forum, commemorating the 100th anniversary of the birth of George Westinghouse.

"The importance of this gathering cannot be overemphasized," said M. W. Smith, vice president of Westinghouse and chairman of the Westinghouse Educational Foundation which arranged the Forum. "It will enable men prominent in their own fields to gain an insight into the problems of others, to correlate present knowledge and to lay the foundation for future research that may contribute materially to the advancement of civilization."

Included are leaders in the development of the atomic bomb, in medical and biological fields, transportation, education and electric power—keystone of the modern industrial world.
