

Men's Suit Supply Expected To Rise

NEW YORK—American men are getting suits at a rate of more than double that at the turn of the year, and supplies should become increasingly greater as the year progresses.

This conclusion came from an International Statistical Bureau, private research organization, study which said about 2,000,000 suits a month currently are flowing into retail stores—a quantity equal to the highest pre-war production rate.

It estimated output this quarter at 6,000,000 suits compared with 3,000,000 in the final quarter of 1945.

The consumer may not see much evidence of an increase in supplies because suits are sold as rapidly as they are received.

Tar Heel Suggests Lewis Be Hung

WASHINGTON—Tar Heel reaction against the prolonged coal strike, and to a lesser extent against John L. Lewis personally, began to have a definite effect on senatorial mail recently.

The offices of both Sen. Josiah W. Bailey, of Raleigh, and Sen. Clyde R. Hoey, of Shelby, reported a sharp upswing in mail recently and credited the increase to the coal strike situation.

The letters and telegrams received by the two senators were practically unanimous in urging that "something" be done to end the strike, with governmental intervention and seizure of the mines, the most frequently suggested remedy, although there was one letter which suggested mildly that Lewis, the mine workers' president, be hung as the first step in remedying the situation.

Full-fledged Turkey
