

Mackey Heads New Combined Office In Canton

The Canton Board of Aldermen have consolidated the office of superintendent of streets and water departments under one head, and named J. D. Mackey to fill the office.

Mr. Mackey has served as chief clerk of the Canton selective service board since October, 1940. Mr. Mackey was formerly city tax collector, serving three years from 1937 to 1939.

W. F. "Bud" Cahn has served as superintendent of streets.

J. R. Sechrest, president of the Champion Y.M.C.A., and connected with the chemical laboratory staff of the Canton Division of the Champion Paper and Fibre Company, will continue to supervise technical operations in connection with the water department.

Mayor Sam Robinson explained that Mr. Sechrest has been handling the major portion of the water activities since James Rickards left the city. With the appointment of Mr. Mackey, Mr. Sechrest will now only handle technicalities in his department.
