The Everyday Counselor

Many people are hard to get along with. But it can be done if there is a will to do it. Domestic difficulties make up many of the problems brought to my study and desk. How to get along happily with husband or wife is a continual plea.

These stories of marital unhappiness sound very much alike. The recital is usually full of "I's." It is what "I" want to do or have done. Usually the one who comes for conference or writes for counsel has wrestled with the problem a long time. It has become so large to them that it has obscured most of the good in the situation.

When a problem stays continually in mind, it has a way of growing.

The more we look at it the larger it grows, and the more difficult it becomes to see any way out.

The Bible gives a striking picture in the story of Daniel, wrestling with the problem which involved his very life.

Daniel had his lifetime habit of praying to God three times daily. Although a very busy man, he let nothing interfere with this practice. No doubt it enabled him to see trouble coming, even before it arrived. He always kept hold of the prayer line.

One artist's conception of the scene in the lion's den has made an indelible impression on my mind. It portrays the prophet standing with his face toward the sunlight streaming through the small grilled window, with his back to the lions. The lions seemed about as unconcerned about him as he about they.

Doolittle Outlines Needs of Aviation
New York.—According to Lieut. Gen. James H. Doolittle, former commander of the United States 8th Air Force, the most pressing need of commercial aviation today is better ground facilities.

Helping to unveil here one of the new DC-4's of the Chicago and Southern Air Lines, incorporating new passenger comfort and high speed features, General Doolittle said:

"We flew from Houston to Chicago in three hours and 38 minutes in one of these ships yesterday. But we were held up more than an hour and a half in taking off by ground conditions and were 33 minutes in getting down in Chicago because of gummy weather conditions."

"What we need now is not only speed in the air in good ships but to save over-all time."

The new Chicago and Southern 50-passenger planes are claimed to be 25 miles an hour faster than other ships of this type, with wider seats and individual radios and other features.
