bushel crop. Mr. Francis, as the others has had to use a complete spraying program to combat scab, which he states has been prevalent in his orchards.

Lugh Masie, owner of an orchard on the Pigeon Road, predicts that he will have a fifty per cent crop this year, but despite the effect of the cold wet Spring weather, he would not normally expect a big crop this season. Last year the Masie orchards yielded a large crop and trees do not bear heavily, generally speaking two years in succession, it was pointed out by Mr. Masie.

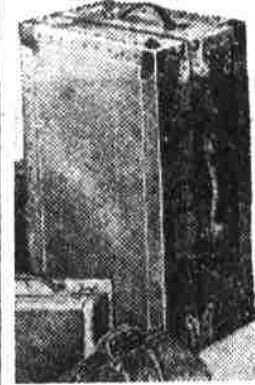

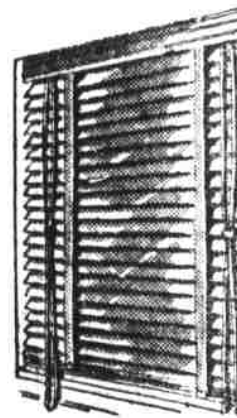
