DISTRIBUTION OF FISH INCREASE... An increase in distribution of fish from State hatcheries during the past six months...

The six-month report shows that 186,135 brook, rainbow and brown trout, totalling 14,743.5 pounds were distributed from the hatcheries at Marion, Roaring Gap, Waynesville and Pineola.

Of warm-water fish, the Fayetteville and Marion hatcheries released 111,800 bass and bream fingerlings weighing 374 pounds; and in addition, 36,500 largemouth bass fry.

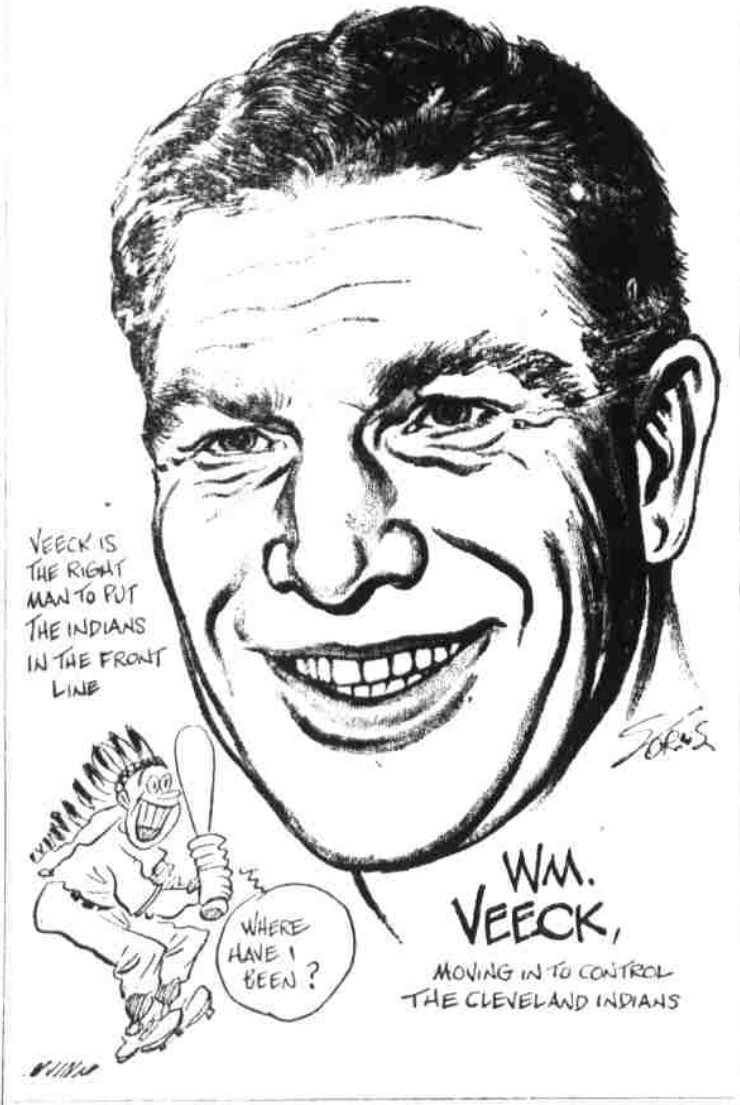
HABERDASHERY NOTE
