Yes, it is only the middle of July, we'll agree, but have you noticed with what strides these intervening months pass on their way? And when the last minute arrives, and you decide it is time to select books for the holiday season you will dash madly from store to store and find everything has already been bought up.

So that is why we are bringing to your attention right now the beautiful, large edition of Walt Disney's "Bambi" that every popular book store has no need to go into detail about either this story or the Disney drawings. outlay of money for highway for any year since the class of Morrison (1911-24).

State Highway Engineer Vance has checked the records and avers that at no time in the history of the highway commission have so many improvements and construction contracts been let in the same length of time (the past 9 months).

**LARGEST** But North Carolina went alone in this highway endeavor. In 1939 the highway board has just approved a one-year \$22,000,000 road building program, the largest annual construction outlay in the history of the State.

**MUST GO!** It now looks as if this State's last Republican solicitor, Avalon E. Hall of Yadkinville (17th Solicitorial District) must go. The Solicitorial Redistricting Committee has spoken, and its recommendation is followed. Hall's predominantly Republican district (Davie, Wilkes, Avery, and Mitchell) will be torn to pieces. Davie and Yadkin would be put in a district with Fredrick, Rowan, Cabarrus, and Union, all but Democratic counties. Hall will be in now until 1950. He could run then, but it would be no use.
