Milner Hits First Homer On H. S. Field

Hazelwood Plays At Canton Field Saturday Afternoon At 3:30 P. M.

Martel Mills came to Hazelwood Wednesday afternoon, saw, but failed to conquer despite the wet field that helped cause more muddled plays than Hazelwood usually makes in a ball game. J. D. Burrell pitched his fifth win of the season while helping in the batting attack that kept up the pressure against Martel throughout the game and Hazelwood added a 10-2 win for their 11th straight of the season.

Their twelfth game will be played Saturday against their old rivals, Champion Y on the Canton field. Canton last week ran up a 4-2 win over Enka and will be taking their third crack at Hazelwood including their non-league game of July 4th when the two teams met together Saturday afternoon. Bud Blalock, who took a rest during most of the Martel game, seems likely to do the mound chores at Canton.

The first home run knocked on the high school field was hit by Bill Milner in the seventh inning of the Martel game. It was a long drive back past the centerfielder, and Bill had to do some fast running to beat the throw in duplicating his circuit-clout in the game against Green River.

Oliver Yount also capped out one of the longest drives hit during the game, scoring Dudley, but getting caught by the throw in to third base. Elmer Dudley took doubles off two of the three Martel hurlers and one single for the best batting record of the game, and Martel's Devese, Gibson, and Player led their attack, but none were able to get more than a single from their hitting.

Player, the shortstop, made both of Martel's tallies, in the second by walking, getting to third on put-out throws and home run a wild pitch, and in the fourth by getting to first base on a hit and coming in when Shook threw a wild one to first trying to catch DeBruhl.

Rains this week have washed food into the creeks, and fishermen are not expecting as good luck this week-end as they have had the past two weeks.

Few anglers have missed their limit on their last trips to near-by trout streams. Up in the Sherwood Forest area last week, Rufus Ratcliff, the game warden, found everyone pleased with their day's labor. At that time the dry weather had lowered the water at the heads of the creeks, and many of the large speckled and rainbow trout that normally stay upstream had come further down to better feeding waters.

Because of this more than half of the catches were rainbow trout, which says the warden is unusual for those that don't go to the head streams for their fishing.

Protected fishing streams in this area that are open this week-end are the following: West Fork of Pigeon, the Davidson River and Furbanks, and Lower South Mills River, all open Saturday and Sunday. In the Mount Mitchell area all streams will be open Friday through Sunday.
