about the same size as the Pet plant here. Officials of the Durham concern pointed out "it is a decided promotion for Mr. Davenport." The dairy is the oldest in Durham.
Mr. Davenport became manager of the Pet plant here in January, 1940, and since that time the sales have increased four hundred per cent, and a fleet of 18 trucks are now being operated. He also assisted in the development of the Pet plant and market in Greenville, S. C.
Before coming to Waynesville, Mr. Davenport was manager of the Pet plant at Johnson City, Tenn., and also served field man in Greenville, Tenn., and Greensboro, Md.
He has been with the Pet Dairy Products Company for the past 12 years, and during his six years in Waynesville he has taken an active part in civic and religious affairs of the community. He served as president of the Chamber of Commerce, and is now a director of the organization. He served as Roll Call chairman of Red Cross, a director of Rotary, and is chairman of the finance committee of the First Baptist Church.
He is a graduate of the University of Kentucky.

Louise Gagnon Again Steals Show In Third Performance by Players

Again Louise Gagnon scored as the outstanding artist taking part in "Ghosts," by Henrik Ibsen, presented by the Summer Players of "The Theatre in the Sky" in the third week of their season here, under the direction of Maurice Geffroy.
Miss Gagnon has stolen the show in the last two plays presented, and the audience had the feeling that she was carrying the others along. She has played each role in the last two productions with an understanding that gives that touch of reality so much coveted by those of the theatre.
Jack Pyle as Oswald Alving, the son, victim of a cruel heritage, played his part well, but gave one the feeling that he could give a much better performance, and that he was not at his best.
June Cole as Regina Engstrand was good, but not quite up to her roles in the former productions. The same might be said of Otto Johnson, Jr., who was not convincing enough to give the character he impersonated the required force.
Taylor Reese as Pastor Manders, had been more familiar with his lines, would have done an excellent job of impersonation, for at times he rose to a point of fine acting.
The music of Phyllis Luis, actress and radio actress, did much to liven up the intermission between acts. No review, however brief of "Ghosts" would be complete without a tribute to Rosemarie Thomas, responsible for the setting and Elma Bene, who designs the costumes for the players. The furnishings and costumes, with the light effect would do credit to any production.
