Five Aircraft Firms To Produce Houses

WASHINGTON—Senator Hugh B. Mitchell (D.), of Washington, said here a survey of the aircraft industry has disclosed that five manufacturers plan to produce houses under the Homes for Veterans program.

The Emergency Housing Act authorizes Government guarantees of a market for prefabricated dwellings.

In a statement issued through his office, Senator Mitchell said he asked a survey of the industry to determine which manufacturers have facilities available to produce houses or house parts and learned there are eight.

Three companies, he said, advised that they are awaiting the results of further studies before deciding whether to go into the housing field.
