

Products May Be For Lifted Controls

The govern-
ment's removal of
controls from flour, bread,
and other bakery products and break-
fast cereals is a day or so
away. The Agriculture Department
asked that the OPA
suspend its "just about
control" that these
products had "just about
decontrolled."

came short as a result of heavy
shipments to famine areas abroad.
With world food needs during the
year ahead still not fully deter-
mined, the government will retain
the control until it is certain that
an export goal of 400,000,000 bush-
els can be met.

The Agriculture Department has
petitions of the milling and bakery
industries for decontrol of flour,
semolina, farina, bread and bak-
ery products. Under provisions of
the OPA law, it must act to mor-
row on the petition affecting bread
and other bakery products. It has
nearly two weeks to act on the
flour petition.

The department official said ac-
tion decontrolling all these prod-
ucts may not be taken in connec-
tion with these petitions, but on
the government's own initiative, as

was the case with livestock and
meats.
The official said the petitions
themselves may be denied to mor-
row, but that the OPA and Agricul-
ture Department jointly may issue
formal decontrol orders later in
the week.

A decontrol petition may be
granted only if the affected com-
modity is plentiful. The official
noted it cannot be said that wheat
is available in ample supply in view
of the world situation.

The tentative decision to lift ceil-
ings from wheat products was said
to be based on the facts that (1)
wheat is free of ceilings, (2) short-
ening, one of the major materials
used in bread and bakery products,
was freed of controls last week, and
(3) President Truman last week di-
rected the OPA and Agriculture
Department to speed up the decon-
trol program.

Despite the government's inten-
tion to hang on to rent controls,
the National Association of Real
Estate Boards said in a statement
that a campaign to abolish them
will be renewed.
