that one out of eight had a disability which was more or less perma-There are now 85,000 disable 1 civilians and 228,000 disabled veterans in the United States available for reemployment. Of these, he said 100,000 disabled veterans are now under training. The disabled veteran wants a

job which gives him the dignity of self-support. He has earned it and is willing to work for it, and to maintain it.

The federal and state government is providing increasing service to enable the disabled and the handicapped to train for employment by which they may earn their livelihood. Any disabled civilian or veteran can learn of this service through the welfare agencies or veteran's organizations.
