Highway Record In State Better

RALEIGH (A) - While North Carolina didn't walk away with any grand awards for highway safety progress, this state was able to present a good safety record to the President's Highway Safety conference last week in Washington.

The state bettered the national average of 10 per cent decrease in fatal traffic accidents by having a 13 per cent decrease for the first quarter of this year. Too. North Carolina's 1946 record was 12.7 persons fatally injured for each 100,-000 miles traveled. This represents a decrease of nearly two per cent from the 1945 average.

Motor Vehicles Commissioner Landon C. Rosser, who attended the safety conference in Washington. said yesterday that the state ranked at the top in the amount of progressive legislation to report.

The 1947 General Assembly en acted many new traffic and allied laws covering recommendations included in the state's highway safety program.


