However, the broadcast started at 2:30 and continued for 20 minutes, with 2 animals being sold during the time, with the first 10 minutes being taken up with introduction of winners of the show, and presentation of Col. McCord, auctioneer.

The broadcast carried well from under the tent, with the noise of cattle in the background and the bids of buyers coming in clearly over the radio.

Engineers kept their fingers crossed as they strung over 1,000 feet of extra line to get the pick-up. The line did not pick up any noises although it was trampled underfoot by hundreds of people during the actual broadcast.
