Collections for the first four months of the current fiscal year are \$36,953,298.28 greater than for the corresponding period of the preceding months, standing \$407,438,443.46 against \$370,485 443.46 against \$370,485,145 18

In the opening three months of the year, collections were reported as follows: July, \$97,000,090.68; Au gust, \$84,204,683.70; September \$122,111,718.90. In the corresponding months of the preceding year collections were \$82,977,838 00 \$83,563,911.33, and \$108,261.437.66 respectively.


