Toll Fees On Parkway Deferred

Members of the North Carolina Park Commission and civic leaders here were elated over the news that plans to impose "toll" fees on the Blue Ridge Parkway in this state and Virginia this season had been called off.

The N. C. Park Commission, of which Charles Ray is chairman, had entered formal protest to the "toll" at a meeting in Washington two weeks ago. Congressmen of the two states, as well as state officials and newspapers had entered bitter protest to the proposal, which would charge 25 cents a car and \$1 per year to use the Parkway.

Secretary of the Interior Krug instructed the Park Service to defer the fee plan this season.

Beer, Wine Vote In 2 Counties Halted By Court

Judge Alley Signs Restraining Order Pending Hearing On Petitions

Elections on beer and wine sales in Jackson and Avery counties, scheduled for today, were halted by legal proceedings on Saturday, when Judge Felix E. Alley, signed temporary restraining orders enjoining elections in both counties, pending outcome of hearings on the Jackson county proceedings on the 12th and Avery on the 14th.

In both instances, the temporary injunctions were granted on the legal technicality that the petitions, requesting the election in these two counties, did not conform with the provisions of the 1947 statute providing for local option on beer and wine.

W. Roy Francis of Waynesville, M. V. Higdon of Sylva and Frank Ferguson of Waynesville represented the petitioners in the Jackson county proceedings.

While these proceedings probably will block early elections on beer and wine in these counties, it is anticipated that other petitions, drawn to conform with the statute, will be circulated by groups seeking to ban beer and wine sales.

The 1947 General Assembly enacted legislation authorizing local option elections on beer and wine upon petition of 15 per cent of the qualified voters. This act also doubled the crown tax on beer and directed that the increase of 14 cents a bottle be distributed among the counties and municipalities on a population basis.

(Continued from Page Two) One of the most amiable and best-liked Senators is ruddy-cheeked John Sparkman, Alabama Democrat, Scott Lucas (D-Ill.) and Henry Cabot Lodge, Jr. (R-Mass.) are among the most handsome. The Senate's president, Arthur Vandenberg, is one of the best dressers, while Arthur Capper (R-Kans.), is considered one of the most indifferent.
