**The Skirt Takes The Blouse**

Many Blouses Play A Suit Accompaniment

The spring blouse blossoms into fashion with a feminine look pared down to neat lace trimmings, functional lines and neckline variety for all occasions.

The Gibson girl look, in its 1949 version, promises to be the season's pretty favorite. Ruffles, smocking, neckline bows or cravats and lady-like standing collars share the turn-of-the-century setting in these easy-to-wear styles of Celanese fabrics. One lovely blouse of Celanese rayon crepe softens the male heart by borrowing his collar and tie for Val lace-edged feminine counterparts.

Interest in these blouses is hardly centered in body alone; the sleeve comes in for its share, whether it be long with shoulder or cuff detail, three-quarter, or short. The blouses which boast long sleeves may have a ruffled cuff to match collar trim, turned-up French cuff to accentuate precise tailoring, or deep high-buttoned cuff as foil to the feminized Gibson cravat. One smart blouse of rich Celanese Chambray crepe in white shows black froggish cuffs to match the Peter Pan, emblem-embellished collar.

This is a year of yokes, square round or suggested, a year of tucks and insertions, but above all, of trills without turbulences. More tailored is a neat club-collared version, in a new rayon crepe, its deep multi-tucked yoke bordered in triple tucks.

**Men Will Wear More Town Wear**

Dress-Up Look Is Now Called For More Often

Men will find that clothes designed especially for town wear have a more dressed-up look than for some time. Coats, suits and accessories are all styled with a marked formal note and are detailed with artfully subtle fabric patterns and tailoring construction. Guard model coats, Chesterfields and Homburg hats, worn with very conservative shirts, will be high fashion notes for urbanites.

In suits there is a tendency towards modified square shoulders and a straight-hanging back. The extra-full drape is gone. Double-breasted jackets continue to stress a low-waisted look. 3-button styles expected to show a great gain in favor among single-breasted suits. Jacket sleeves are more noticeably tapered.

New topcoat styles stress lower button placement, roomier cut and the revival of patterned fabrics. One new model is a roomy raglan with a very full skirt and military collar. These features give the coat truly casual and sporty air and make it highly desirable for comfort in traveling as well as for general use. Topcoats meant for town and dress-up wear are slightly fitted, come in single and double-breasted models, and will be available in wider color ranges of fine coverts and tweeds.

1948 sports jackets are featuring single-breasted designs with three buttons and three patch pockets. Most of these are very light in weight and some are longer than before, with two rear vents and slanted pockets. Fancy backs with shirring and half-belts have been revived somewhat in the newest models. Many new colors have been added in this field, since men will accept new color ideas most readily in their leisure clothes. Slacks to wear with these also come in a greater color variety. These bring new interest with added colors in flannels and feather-weight worsted gabardines. Color offerings in all sportswear include bright shades of rust, blue, green and yellow.

Gabardine emerged in the current Men's Fashion Guild of New York offerings as the most important men's fabric of the year. Prominently featured in almost every item of a man's wardrobe, sleek gabardine has been tailored into handsome topcoats, suits, leisure jackets, and slack ensembles, sport shirts, and swim trunks.
