The average price for tobacco sold on the Asheville market this season was \$45.25, according to an announcement of the U. S. Department of Agriculture.

Applications Are Being Taken For Lake Postmaster

Applications will be received until April 1 by the U. S. Civil Service Commission for the position of postmaster at Lake Junaluska, now being held on a temporary basis following the resignation of Mrs. Willard Moody.

The position pays a yearly salary of \$2,800. Eligibility requirements include residence in the Lake Junaluska mail delivery area for at least one year; that the applicant be in good physical condition and within the prescribed age limits, 21 to 63. Applicants will take a written test at Waynesville, and will also be rated on their educational and business or professional experience, general qualifications and suitability.
