Saturday will mark the opening of the 5-mile section of the Blue Ridge Parkway in Pisgah National Forest, according to Sam Weems superintendent.

This section of the Parkway has been closed to the public since last fall. While it is still a deadend drive, it affords some of the best scenic views in Eastern America, especially from Green Knob, where a 300-degree panorama of hundreds of mountain ranges can be seen.

Mr. Weems called attention to the fact that the stone on the Parkway is loose and will not permit speeding. The section will be under constant patrol while open.

This section of the Parkway can be reached from Waynesville or Brevard over U. S. Highway No. 276. The place is 20 miles from Waynesville.
