Barron of Fenway

winnings to the hospital. Almost everyone connected with the tournament expressed the exact sentiments that "If anyone deserved to win the Round Robin, it was Barron.

The 38-year-old professional sprained his ankle during the first day but he couldn't quit. Too many fellows at Fenway were rooting for him. And no doubt some of them had a couple of bucks bet on their favorite.

So Barron saw a doctor, got a couple of shots of novocaine and went on his merry way up hill and down dale, beating 11 of his first 12 rivals at match play.

He beat the Demaret, Mangrum, Harmon, Keiser and Palmers by a stable margin and lost only to Henry Cotton of England by one hole. On the final day he lost his match to Vic Ghezzi and Hogan both by one up. Only three of 15 stars beat the Barron.

The triumph was a victory for the "club pro" the fellow who so busy teaching golfers how to correct their hooks and slices that he doesn't get much chance to hit the tournament trail.

Claude Harmon of Mamaroneck, Winged Foot club, knows how it feels for he's in the same class as Barron—a "club pro." Harmon recently won the Masters at Augusta, Ga., and attributes his victory to the friends he made while teaching the game. They cheered him on much in the manner of Barron's "pupils."

Barron played his first golf when he was 11. He shut a 113. Second time out he had an 88. The phenomena didn't end there for at the age of 15 he was his own boss—a club professional at Port Chester, N. Y.

In 1930 at the age of 20 he took part in his first U. S. Open and shot 306. The next year he tied for 15th with 301. His best effort in the Open was in 1940 when he finished tied for fourth to win \$500. He was only one stroke away from victory that year at Canterbury in Cleveland, but there was a triple tie for first. In 1941 he tied for fifth at Fort Worth. Last year he was 27th at St. Louis.

Barron's biggest catch was his \$10,000 first prize in Chicago's "Tam o' Shanter" two years ago. "But it was the Open I wanted to win that year," says the Barron of Fenway.

It seems some of his friends wanted to make a movie that might have netted Barron \$100,000. But he lost that open. Now he has his mind set on the 48th U. S. Open which will be held in Los Angeles June 10-12. The Barron of Fenway might make that movie yet.

Indiana Soap Relieves Children In Bremen

BREMEN, Germany (UP)—Eighteen boxes of soap for Bremen school children arrived here from the small town of Bremen, Ind., a settlement founded by emigrants from this city.

Almost half a ton of soap was collected by children of Bremen, Ind., after they had learned through a letter that more than seven percent of all school children in Bremen are suffering from skin diseases. Elizabeth Means, now with military government here, formerly was a principal of a Bremen, Ind., school.

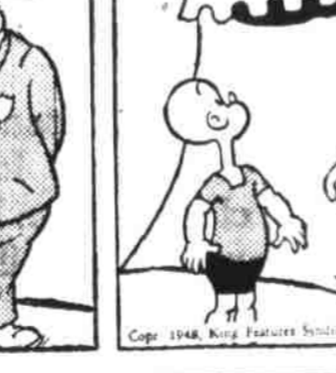

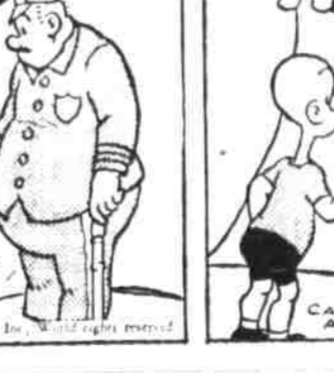

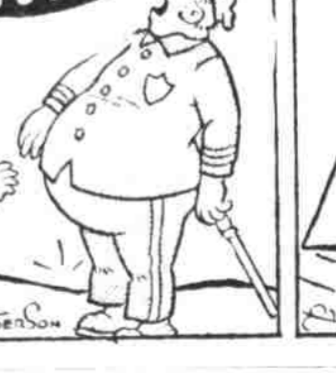
