

Teaching School Holds Attraction For But Few

A change in the present community attitude toward teachers is necessary to attract more young people into the teaching profession, according to college sophomores answering questions of the State Education Commission.

About 20 percent of the current crop of 12,000 sophomores in all types of colleges in North Carolina took part in the statewide poll. The community's attitude toward the teacher's social life, status in the community and living conditions should be improved, the young people feel.

There is "too much community interest in private affairs," one young woman said.

"Once a woman starts teaching, she seems to continue it permanently," frankly complained another. "I want to get married."

Many students felt that the community should provide adequate living quarters for its school help. They also complained of unsatisfactory sanitary facilities in the school buildings.

A majority of the white girls in-

terviewed said that a starting salary of from \$200 to \$240 would be sufficient to induce them to teach. Of this group, 456 said they would not teach for the present \$1,620 and 141 said they would. Those who would start at this figure, however, would feel that they deserved more money. As one girl put it, "I am interested in teaching because I believe the improvement of the educational system is largely dependent on the individual teaching in the grammar grades. I am willing to teach at a sacrifice of money to help accomplish this."

Of the white men, 906 would refuse to teach for the present salary and only 39 would enter the profession. Most of them say they can make more money in private business, and many want year-round work.

"Insecurity" is one man's reason for not teaching. He says a teaching position is "dependent on the whims of the immediate superior." A 17 year old young lady adds, "Although the spirit may be willing, the flesh could be a trifle weak."

Presidential Elector To Have Easy Trip

TOPEKA, Kans. (UP)—One of the shortest trips a United States presidential elector will make to cast a vote after the November elections will be that of Bert Mitchner.

In turning in an official Kansas ballot for president, Mitchner will have to go only from his fifth floor state house desk, where he is a revenue and taxation commissioner, to the second floor capitol office of the secretary of state.

And there'll be no mileage. The elevator service is free.

In addition to better community attitude and more pay, the sophomores want in this order: more adequate equipment and facilities, reduced teacher load, and a more adequate retirement plan.

Results of the poll were announced by W. H. Plenniums, Executive Secretary of the State Education Commission. The Commission is conducting a two-year study of the state's public school system.

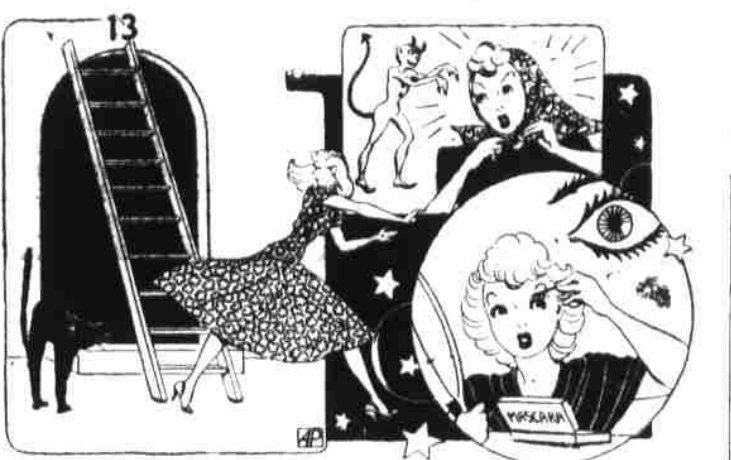
