



Fluffy Mashed Potatoes Panned Zucchini Squash, Tomatoes and Onions* Breed and Butter Floating Island

Beverage Recipe for Starred Dish Follows) Panned Zucchini Squash, Tomatoes and Onlone

3 tablespoons butter or margarine cup (2 gmall) thinly sliced

neavy 10-inch skillet over medium heat; add onions and cook, stirring requently, until partly tender and slightly yellowed, about 5 minutes Turn heat low and add green pepper. While onion and pepper are cooking wash zuechini squash well and pare skin partially off, in verical striped effect. Slice thinly rito skillet and mix well with onion and green pepper, Peel tomatoes.

Sauteed Figh Fillets with Lemon half into quarter or sixth wedges, and slice into skillet, cutting each Add salt, pepper, basil and allspice mix well to distribute seasoning over vegetables and cover skillet tightly.
