FRIDAY FARE

Sauteed Fish Fillets with Lemon Wedges
Fluffy Mashed Potatoes
Panned Zucchini Squash, Tomatoes and Onions*
Bread and Butter
Floating Island

(Recipe for Starred Dish Follows)

Panned Zucchini Squash, Tomatoes and Onions

- 3 tablespoons butter or margarine
1 cup (2 small) thinly sliced onions
1/4 cup thin strips green pepper
1 pound zucchini squash
2 small (1/2 pound) tomatoes
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon sugar
1/4 teaspoon black pepper
1/4 teaspoon dried basil
1/16 teaspoon ground allspice

Melt butter or margarine in heavy 10-inch skillet over medium heat; add onions and cook, stirring frequently, until partly tender and slightly yellowed, about 5 minutes. Turn heat low and add green pepper. While onion and pepper are cooking wash zucchini squash well and pare skin partially off, in vegetable striped effect. Slice thinly into skillet and mix well with onion and green pepper. Peel tomatoes,

having removed stem, cut in half and slice into skillet, cutting each half into quarter or sixth wedges. Add salt, pepper, basil and allspice; mix well to distribute seasonings over vegetables and cover skillet tightly. Increase heat slightly and cook for 5 to 10 minutes, stirring a few times, until squash is just tender. Serve immediately with pan liquor, 4 servings.

1/4 cup butter or margarine
1 egg, separated
1/4 pound soft yellow cheese, grated
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon dry mustard
1/2 teaspoon paprika
1/4 cup mayonnaise or mayonnaise-type salad dressing
Twelve 1/2-inch cubes white bread, trimmed of crusts
Cream butter or margarine; add egg yolk which has been beaten well, and mix thoroughly. Add

Buchanan was killed in France January 6, 1946, while on duty in the Salisbury National Cemetery at Salisbury last Wednesday afternoon.

Technician Buchanan lived with his grandparents, Robert O. Osborne and the late Mabel Welch Osborne. He was inducted in the Army in October, 1942, at 18 years of age and had served 18 months overseas prior to his death.
