### Large Number of Boats Used For Pleasure At Lake

A large crowd enjoyed the informal "show" staged by some 10 large motor boats on Lake Junaluska Monday afternoon. This was the first time this season that boats with motors larger than 5-horsepower were permitted on the lake. Most motors used Monday were of 22-horsepower size.

Most of the boat owners were from Waynesville and Canton, and devoted most of the afternoon to "straight" riding, but at times lining in circles and opening up the throttles. The boats stayed in the dam, and did not venture beyond that point.

A large crowd lined the banks to watch the boats maneuver about the lake and many were taken for rides by their friends who owned boats.

Boatsmen in this area are anxious to work out a special time of the week for using that portion of the lake for general pleasure riding.
